In October last year, it was a privilege to award the first Jan Early Memorial Scholarship to Lorna Humm of Mt Somers.

This very generous scholarship, worth \$10,000, was donated by Jan's family, specifically to encourage local women to further their leadership and governance development. Jan, who sadly died in 2023, was a passionate supporter of Advance Ashburton and was a valued member of the Communications Committee. She had had multiple leadership and governance roles within the community and with respected business entities.

Lorna, a senior veterinarian, as well as an active farmer in her own right, was one of 20 applicants for the scholarship. She excelled at interview. Her answers to questions from two separate panels of interviewers were thoughtful, considered and concise. She showed a depth of understanding of the role and responsibilities of governance and leadership.

Current positions held by Lorna include chair of Provelco and the West Coast Branch of the NZ Deer Farmers Association. Both show her commitment to governance and leadership. Her long-term aspirations are to make a meaningful contribution to primary industry in New Zealand, as well as participating in local community activities and organisations. Since receiving the award Lorna has been



appointed to the Mt Somers Springburn School Board of Trustees.

Lorna plans to use the award to undertake Institute of Directors' courses relevant to governance. Advance Ashburton believes that Lorna will, in her own special way, and with the wonderful encouragement of the Early family, be an asset to our community going forward.


The Advance Ashburton Annual Celebration of Philanthropy will be held at 5.30pm on Wednesday 16th October at the Ashburton Event Centre.

CHILD & YOUTH FUND

To celebrate the 20th anniversary of Advance Ashburton in 2023, we launched a new community fund to support local causes related to children and young people up to 18 years of age.

Since the launch, this Fund has been growing steadily thanks to a number of significant donations and several new payroll givers.

We acknowledge the generosity of the founding donor, Ashburton Farmers Market Committee, who gave the initial donation of \$6,000 to start this Fund. We also extend our gratitude to new Advance Ashburton donor, Bruce Leighton, who is the first Platinum Donor to the Child & Youth Fund. Then, prior to Christmas, Advance Ashburton Trustees, committee

members, Friends of the Foundation and staff added a further \$1,060 to the Fund through our Christmas Giving programme.

We welcome donations to the Advance Ashburton Child & Youth Fund at any time, and one of the simplest ways to make your donation is through Payroll Giving.

Because the Foundation has approved donee status with the IRD, employees can make regular donations direct from their wages/salary. If you visit the IRD website and search Payroll Giving, you will find the process very simple. The Foundation receives immediate and regular funds, and the donor receives immediate tax credits in the form of reduced PAYE, so there is no waiting until the end of the financial year to hand in receipts.

For example, a weekly donation of \$6.00 costs the employee only \$4.00 because the tax rebate of 33.3% is immediately credited against the tax to be deducted each week. Over a five-year period, 15 people donating \$6.00 per week will result in \$23,400 being donated to the Advance Ashburton Child

& Youth Fund, and tax rebates for the employees totalling \$7,800.

Advance Ashburton is also able to receive one-off donations of any size, or regular automatic payments to the Advance Ashburton Child & Youth Fund. Payments can be made to the Advance Ashburton account: 02-0836-0071001-002. Please include your name and contact details (e.g. phone number or email address) and use 'Child&Youth' as the payment reference. Then, we will be able to issue a receipt so that you can claim a tax credit of 33.3% of your donation. +

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FACILITY UPGRADE COMPLETE

An official blessing in November 2023 celebrated the completion of the newly refurbished Child, Adolescent and Family (CAF) mental health facility based at Ashburton Hospital.

Previously used for temporary accommodation for hospital staff, the facility was upgraded in a three-stage renovation beginning in 2020. Advance Ashburton granted \$164,000 to finance the project thanks to the generosity provided by the R.G. and H.A. Sinclair Fund and the Lynda Frampton Fund.

The project was completed in three parts so the facility could stay open throughout, despite the structural renovations required. The new space includes whānau rooms, offices, an extended kitchen and lounge area, and upgraded bathrooms, all with fresh décor and furnishings.

Overall, the facility is warm, welcoming, and empathetic to the needs of the young people



and their whānau whilst they are supported by the specialist mental health team in Ashburton. The therapy spaces contain a variety of sensory items including weighted animals and Lego, as well as artwork chosen with children and adolescents in mind. A further donation towards artwork and a painting was generously gifted by Advance Ashburton donor, Kay Begg, in memory of her son, Martin.

Having the CAF mental health facility in Ashburton means that it can directly liaise with other local health providers, and child and adolescent services. It also makes it easier for Ashburton families to access the mental health service by removing the burden of travelling to Christchurch for care and support. •

ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIPS

The 2024 Scholarship Presentation Ceremony was held at the Ashburton Event Centre on 30th January. Scholarships with a combined value of \$103,000 were presented to 30 recipients from Mid Canterbury for study, training, and personal development.

The scholarships are highly sought after and the calibre of recipients in 2024 was excellent. The recipients were selected from 102 people following a rigorous process which included a written application, a personal interview with Advance Ashburton Trustees and relevant industry leaders, and referee endorsements. Aside from continued excellence in their studies or training, recipients also demonstrated a willingness

to give back to their community through coaching, leadership, or volunteer work.

The premier scholarship of the evening, the Neil Sinclair Memorial Scholarship, was presented to Bachelor of Science Honours student, Jonty Small. Jonty impressed the interview panel as an intelligent and driven person who has the potential to be an outstanding doctor in the future.

The late Neil Sinclair was passionate about supporting the Ashburton community and established the Advance Ashburton Community Foundation in 2003. Jeanette Sinclair, Neil's wife, was pleased to award the scholarship to Jonty as a very worthy recipient. •

Sifala was also the top student in History in both Year 12 and Year 13.
